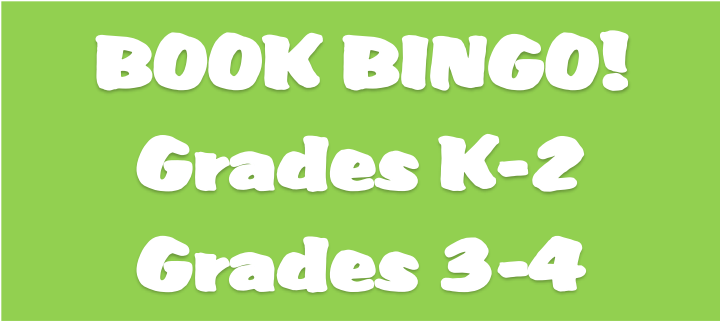
How does Kids' Book Bingo work?

- Write the title in the corresponding square on the card and the date you finished the book.
- You will be awarded a ticket to the Carmel Cinema for each bingo completed, for a maximum of five tickets for a blackout card (all squares completed).

The details:

- Beginner readers can have books read to them.
- You are on your honor to read books before adding them to your bingo card. Only add books read between January and March 2017.
- Suggestions for titles in each category are available from Miss Robin and at the circulation desk.
- Bingo will run January 9, 2017 through March 31, 2017 or as long as movie ticket supplies last.
- Reed Library employees and trustees are not eligible.
