Saturday July 29 at 11 am

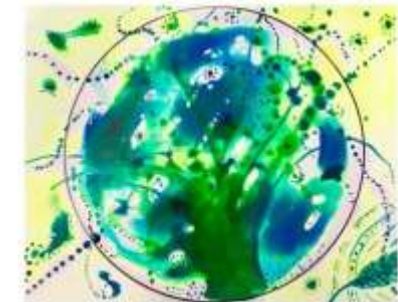
